2016 Heritage Programs

Bret Bicoy, President & CEO of the Door County Community Foundation, Inc. will be the featured speaker at the SBHS annual meeting on June 29, 2016.

Since graduating from Tufts University, Bret has served with a number of charitable foundations. Originally from Hawaii, he has earned awards for his work including being named a Fellow of the Council of Foundations in Washington, D.C.

Most recently, before moving to Door County, Bret was the Senior Foundation Officer of the Green Bay Community Foundation. While there, he helped launch the Door County Community Foundation and assumed his position with the Foundation in 2008.

The Foundation is the custodian of 200 charitable



funds and manages a total of \$16 million. The charities in the Foundation support a variety of causes including education, recreation, the arts, social causes, environmental issues and

many others faced by Door County. Since its inception it has distributed more than \$5 million. By pooling the assets of several organizations, the Foundation is able to employ professional investment advice that is not otherwise available to smaller charities.

The SBHS maintains two funds with the Foundation:
A Reserve Operating Fund intended to support operating costs in the event annual income is insufficient and an Endowment Fund which is intended to grow over time and provide support for the Historical Society from income earned.

Members will recall that a generous bequest from the estate of Peg Foster, in 2011, enabled the SBHS to establish both the Operating Reserve Fund and the Legacy Endowment Fund.

A STATEMENT OF NEED

The Sister Bay Historical Society is a not for profit organization whose main project has been the creation and operation of the Corner of the Past Museum in Sister Bay. The museum now includes fifteen historic structures and a multitude of historic artifacts, most of which have been donated by residents of our area.

As local interest in the preservation of local history and artifacts has increased, our accumulated artifacts have surpassed our ability to properly store and display them. We must

frequently turn down offers of appropriate items and fear that they will be lost forever as a result.

Our current and future needs include the following:

1.Additional display and storage space for large items such as vintage farm equipment and items which require weather proof storage and display space. 2.Additional toilet space and increased access to water.3.Work space in which to repair & restore artifacts. 4.Archival storage

space for documents and photographs.

To alleviate this problem, we anticipate the construction of an additional building at the Corner of the Past designed and constructed to meet these needs. Such a building will expand our ability to preserve and display some of the many historical artifacts still available in the Sister Bay area and the ability to more effectively serve our community and visitors by operating a first class museum and historical resource. In order to accomplish this we are seeking additional funding resources.

All docents/museum guides are requested to come to the Annual Information Meeting at the Old Anderson House Museum on Monday, May 9, 2016 at 10 am.




Did you miss the "Wizard of Oz" film shown in our historic barn last summer?
